#### A new GIS Enrolment Zone

The Glenfield Intermediate School Board is in the process of implementing an enrolment scheme in conjunction with the Ministry of Education under section 11H(1) of the Education Act 1989.

The implementation of this enrolment zone is in response to predicted roll growth in our area over the coming years. The zone will alleviate overcrowding and ensure that the school can effectively plan and manage for future property developments. At Glenfield Intermediate School, we believe the proposed zone will have a positive impact on the pathway for the Kaipātiki Kāhui Ako.
