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### A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents, Caregivers and Whanau

The end of the year is approaching fast and there is still a lot to achieve. I am very impressed with the students focus and commitment to their learning. Please keep discussing learning with your children and asking them what is coming up at school. It is a busy time and the students need to make sure that you know what is happening.

### School Donation Replacement Scheme:

A Budget 2019 initiative will see Decile 1-7 state and state integrated Boards of Trustees able to choose to receive a \$150 per student, per year payment added to the school operations grant instead of seeking donations from parents. Although donations to schools are voluntary, families can feel under pressure to pay them and this can place pressure on household budgets. This initiative is designed to alleviate that pressure and expectation. It also recognises that Decile 1-7 schools can find it difficult to raise funds from their communities. Boards of Trustees that opt-in to the donations scheme will still be able to ask parents and guardians for payments related to optional activities outside the curriculum, for example optional after-school sports.

The GIS Board of Trustees has agreed to accept the scheme for 2020 and as such will not be asking for school donations next year. However the technology fee will still be in place to cover the take home component on the programme. The \$150 per student provided by the Ministry of Education is to cover donations and compulsory school trips and events, but excludes optional activities such as overnight camps and after-school sport fees. The Board believes that this will take a significant pressure off many of our families. The school staff will have to make decisions about the frequency and contexts of trips and events in order to work within the budget provided, but we are committed to maintaining a range of experiences for our learners.

### Staff Changes for 2020

We have a number of changes for 2020 which is both sad but also very exciting. We also have roll growth for 2020 which means an additional teacher has been employed.

We are saying farewell to the following staff members at the end of 2019.

- Mr Jack Yoon is moving to a school that is closer to where he lives.
- Ms Rachel Walsh has secured a position at a private school in the Performing Arts department.
- Miss Amie Judge who has been on maternity leave for 2019 has resigned her position.

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, I would like to thank these staff members for their service to the Glenfield Intermediate community and wish them all the best.

Teachers moving to part-time or study in 2020.

- Mrs Julie Prince has decided to move to a part time position at GIS for 2020. She will be working in a variety of classrooms, as well as focusing on the teaching of science at GIS.
- Mrs Rachel Anderson has been granted a Study Award for 2020 focusing on te reo Māori and will return to us in late 2020. This is an amazing opportunity for Mrs Anderson to study and bring this new knowledge back to GIS.
