A message from the Board Presiding Member

Dear Parents and Caregivers

The NZEI has advised the Glenfield Intermediate School Board that its member teachers and principal at our school will be taking strike action on 16 March 2023. The Board has carefully considered the availability of non-union teaching staff and have decided that we are unable to provide normal instruction during the strike. Therefore, the school will officially be closed for instruction on 16 March 2023.

It is important that you make alternative arrangements for the care of your child/children during the period of the strike as no supervision can be provided. We know that this is inconvenient for parents and students alike. Please be assured that student safety is our main concern.

Why are the teachers striking?

Unfortunately, the funding for our schools is not enough for teachers to give the time we would like to support all our kids to thrive. We need to attract and retain high quality educators by ensuring that teaching is a valued and attractive profession. Principals and teachers in primary and area schools (along with our secondary colleagues) have considered at length the offers from the government to settle the respective collective agreements. The offers presented did not meet the expectations, nor make sufficient steps towards the changes we need for our children to succeed. Therefore the vote to take industrial action has been made. It was not made lightly. Together with your support, building a case for better investment in our students is the priority.

You can choose to wear black on Thursday 16th March to support teachers and principals.

Goals for student progress

Message from Mrs Stevenson and Mr Allison

Teachers, parents and experts all agree. Mental health education has never been more crucial for our children. We are lucky to be going into our 2nd year with Mitey to support the mental health and wellbeing of all our students.

The Sir John Kirwan Foundation has designed Mitey with NZ teachers and the University of Auckland to provide an evidence-based approach to teaching mental health education to primary and intermediate-aged children. It is built around the NZ curriculum and embedded into everyday learning, to ensure children are equipped with the age-appropriate skills and knowledge they need to recognise and respond to mental health issues in both themselves and others.

The last few years have brought increased awareness of the alarming number of children experiencing mental health issues in New Zealand. If children are mentally and emotionally healthy they are better equipped to face the challenges life brings.

Learner Value Focus

Working Collaboratively is our learner value focus for the next two weeks. We realise that learning to work in a collaborative way is an essential 21st century skill that our students need to develop. Working together gives our students the chance to hear diverse perspectives, fosters creativity and innovation, and enhances the learning process by the sharing of knowledge and resources. Collaborative learning also helps our students to develop important social skills like communication, negotiation, and conflict resolution. At GIS we will continue to explicitly teach the skills required to work in a collaborative way to ensure our students are set up for success both now and in the future.

Writer's Toolbox

One of the tools we use to assist our students during the writing process is Writer's Toolbox. This is used schoolwide in all classes and with all students. Writer's Toolbox is a cloud-based online writing tool that provides our students with an interactive environment where their writing skills are both reinforced and extended. Students can practice writing techniques they learn in class and gauge and monitor their own progress. The key advantage of this purpose-built educational writing tool is feedback. Artificial Intelligence built into the tool reads student work and provides instant individualised feedback according to the student's age and ability level. What's more, the tool plots a learning journey for each student so that their writing skill level and cognitive processing skills around writing advance. If you have not yet had the opportunity to see Writer's Toolbox in action ask your child to log on to the tool and show you how it works.

Maths at GIS

Many of our students have been working hard on their multiplication and division recall. Knowing these facts enables students to more readily understand other aspects of mathematics. If a student can recall their 1x, 2x, 5x, and 10x tables, then there are only 21 other facts to learn. Here is a [link](#) to a resource that could be made at home to practise these facts.

Another maths focus for this term is algebra. This topic requires a good understanding of the relationship between multiplication and division. It would be great if you could encourage your child to keep practising their times tables at home. You can find out more about the learning objectives in algebra here on the [nzmaths](#) website.

All classes now have access to [Maths Pad](#) - an online platform where students can work independently or teachers can set specific tasks related to classroom learning. Videos explain a concept then provide lots of practice opportunities.

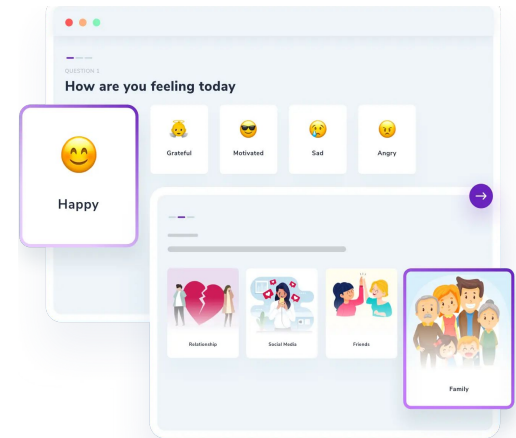
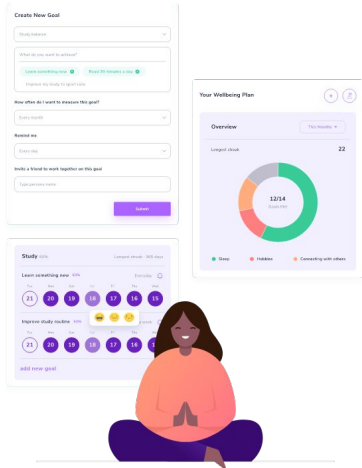

Skodel a Wellbeing check-in for student

We are really excited to offer Skodel check-ins for our students. Skodel check-ins create a moment for students to reflect on how they're feeling and identify what's behind that feeling. This is online tool where students can quickly check in with the teachers. Teachers will be introducing this to their students in the next few weeks.

- Easily provide a safe space for your students to identify how they are really feeling and what's behind it.
- Improve emotional regulation with immediate support to help students understand the feeling they are experiencing and how to manage it
- Build students' self awareness with insights to help them track their feelings and the key influences on these over time.

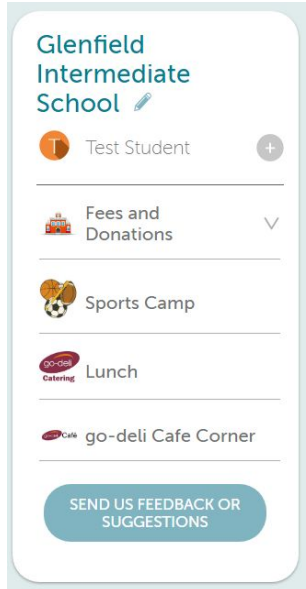

HPV and Boostrix Immunisations

Consent forms for the HPV and Boostrix immunisations were sent home this week. Please ensure you complete these and return them to the office, even if you do not wish for your child to receive the immunisation.

Year 7 & 8 school-based immunisation programme 2023

Year 7 students will be offered Boostrix vaccine (Tdap) in school. This vaccine is a booster of tetanus, diphtheria, and whooping cough (pertussis). Most children received these immunisations as pre-schoolers. This is scheduled for 18/05/2023 with a catchup date 1-2 weeks later for students absent on the day.

Year 8 students will be offered human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine in school. This is a New Zealand schedule vaccine that is recommended to be given at 12 years of age. Students need two doses with a 6-month gap between dose 1 and 2. This is scheduled for 18/05/2023 with a catchup date 1-2 weeks later for students absent on the day.
